Students Have Questions on School Reopening... Please Answer Them Now

Monday morning, I sent out a survey to 10 of my friends to see what concerns they had about school reopening. I invited them to forward the survey to other students. In less than 12 hours, I received 68 responses and 87 questions.

I know my sample size is relatively small, but I was able to identify clear patterns in my findings. These are the observations I would like to share with those planning school reopening.


Communicate Early and Often With Students

I never expected to receive 68 responses and 87 questions so quickly. There is no doubt that students have serious anxiety over issues surrounding school reopening, and that this is on the top of their minds. The overwhelming tone was that students wanted answers as soon as possible. The lack of understanding about what to expect when they return to school is causing additional stress. I realize the situation is very fluid and that schools do not have all the answers yet. However, any information on what is already settled would go a long way in easing the concerns of my peers.

Health and Safety is the Greatest Concern

Of all the questions submitted, 63% were related to health and safety. It's worth noting that I live in a COVID hotspot and many of my peers attend high-density schools. However, I would be surprised if the responses were not similar in other parts of the country. Their concerns included the most basic parts of a school day, such as the bus rides, walking down the halls, classroom layout, and eating lunch.

When I asked how nervous students were about returning to school on a scale of 1 through 10, 58% of responses were 8, 9, or 10 (see figure below). On the flip side, when asked how nervous students were about school not reopening, only 25% of responses were 8, 9, or 10.



These responses combined with the nature of their questions leads me to believe that a great deal of the anxiety students are feeling is over concern for their health and well-being.

Clarity on Transitioning and Scheduling is Critical

The next largest group of questions was about the learning structure for the new school year. Quite simply, students want to know what their day might look like. Our world as we knew it was turned upside-down with no warning, so being provided with some notice of what our new world might look like would relieve some of the fear and uncertainty.

School is Much More Than Just Academic

Over 85% of the students who responded participate in sports, academic teams, clubs, student government, arts programs, and other extracurricular activities. The absence of these activities creates an emotional gap in student lives. It also leaves them with a large amount of free time, which could be used in an unproductive and potentially destructive manner. Whether schools restart physically or virtually, it is crucial that we find ways to continue these programs.

Final Thoughts

We realize that you don't have all of the answers yet, but the more you can communicate to students early in the process, the more anxiety and stress you will relieve. You can start by answering the questions from my peers, which I have included below.

Student Questions on School Reopening

Health and Safety

- 15. Will they enforce a mandated mask requirement?

- 18. How are they going to ensure that children adhere to social distancing rules? How are they going to react if kids start contracting COVID-19?
- 19. How are you gonna make sure students follow cdc guidelines

- 37. Will it be worth more people getting sick for 'better instruction'?
- 38. My school is overpopulated, how do you expect to pack as many students back into classrooms during a global pandemic given that they were already overly full before any virus?
